ANNUAL HOLOCAUST ASSEMBLY

Each spring the German Department sponsors the annual Holocaust Assembly which features two distinguished speakers who return every year to impart their knowledge and experiences to students.

Mr. Paul Whitham is a former Rockford resident who is an authority on the Holocaust. He has taught the Holocaust to educators and has spoken all over the world about this horrific time period. Mr. Whitham skillfully discusses the causes of the Holocaust and how they pertain to the world we live in today. **Mrs. Lisl Bogart** is a survivor of the Holocaust. Mrs. Bogart grew up in what is now the Czech Republic and was sent to the Terezin (Theresienstadt) Concentration Camp. She has an amazing story to tell the students and helps to personalize the Holocaust for them.

This year's assembly will be on **May 11, 2010**, during 1st and 2nd periods in the PAC. Teachers who are interested have signed up their classes to attend, and students may only attend the assembly if one of their teachers has made arrangements to be there. We are very fortunate to have two knowledgeable speakers come to our school to discuss this horrific historical event. **Mr. Brown**, a German teacher, organizes this assembly, with the assistance of the BHS German Club and **Miss Groh**, a retired BHS German teacher.

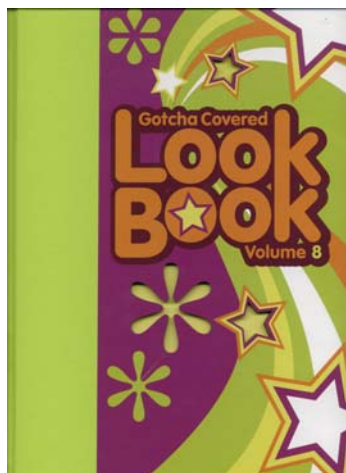
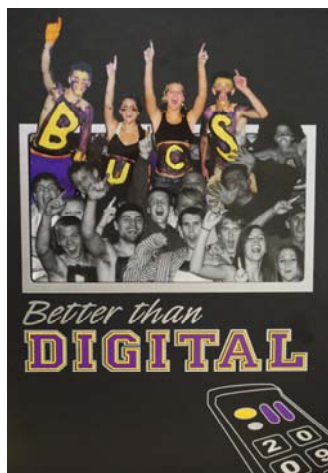

DECA TAKES HONORS, HELPS HAITI

Belvidere High School's DECA chapter worked hard this year and, as a result, was successful at both the Sectional and State competitions. At these competitions members are required to take two exams, along with participating in two role plays where the members interact with a judge. At Sectionals, eighteen BHS members received top ten honors and three members received top three in their events.

At the State Career Development Conference in March, BHS's DECA members competed against 900 individuals from across the state. Despite the challenge, our DECA program did outstanding at this year's State competition and came home with nine members receiving top ten in their event category.



To qualify for the International competition in Louisville, Kentucky in April, the members had to receive top three in their event at S-CDC. This year five members qualified, which makes this the 5th year BHS DECA has made it to Internationals. These members include **Danika Tillis, Dana Glasenapp, Patrick McKiski, Gaby Pasillas** and **Gerry Ponce**. Danika Tillis also received the Frank Vignola Award. This award is given to only one member in the state of Illinois and this is the second year in a row a BHS student received this award (**Kaitlyn Fondrk** 2009). **Mr. Hobbs**, BHS's Chapter Advisor, received the Chapter Advisor of the Year award.

Sophomore **Hannah Gustafson** will also be attending Internationals for the LEADS program that assists DECA members in learning about becoming a State Officer and leading a large organization.

During the week prepping for state, the junior board member met with District 100's Superintendent **Mr. Michael Houselog**. This junior board consists of two students from every school in the district. One of the issues that they talked about was district unity.

Mr. Houselog was approached by one of the directors from Heartland who was doing a fundraiser called Million Meals for Haiti. The money raised would go directly to meals that would be shipped to the people of Haiti. We felt that our district, elementary schools, middle schools, and both high schools could unite for a good cause. So DECA took this opportunity and ran with it. Belvidere High School DECA decided to hold an assembly where they showed a documentary of the people of Haiti and the issues they face and welcomed two speakers, one of which was actually in Haiti during the devastating earthquake. During the assembly, DECA held a "Miracle Minute" where they raised over \$800.00 in under a minute. DECA also sold T-shirts that were designed by their very own DECA members. DECA also held an after school Sport's Olympic night in which students and faculty participated. With the help of the athletic department and **Mr. Bryon Houy**, DECA hosted an obstacle course event where teams would compete for the best time. This included games of basketball, football, golf, and many more games. Students along with faculty were encouraged to participate or come and support teams. Overall, Belvidere High School raised over \$3,800.00 in just two days. Belvidere High School got to see the money they raised go directly to the meals. The following weekend students from the entire district volunteered to pack the meals that would be directly sent to Haiti. Dana Glasenapp said, "It was nice to see the whole district involved and get together for a good cause. It wasn't about what school raised the most money, it was about how District 100 could raise the most money that would provide meals to Haitians." DECA is very proud to have shown the community of Belvidere, how we made a change in the lives of the people of Haiti.
