## **TEACHER E-MAIL**

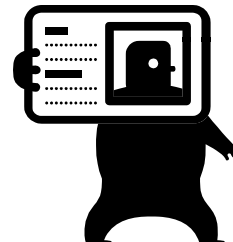
If you have questions or concerns that you wish to discuss with your student's teacher(s), we encourage you to contact them via their e-mail account.

## **STUDENT ID'S**

## NINTH GRADE HOUSE PEER TUTORING

Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:00-4:00 p.m. in the Library. An activity bus is provided for bus riders.

- Students will be referred by their Freshman House teachers.
- Students who have not been referred may stop by the tutoring center, but the students who have been referred will be seen first and then all other students will be seen on a first come, first served basis.
- 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students will work as peer tutors.
- The goal of the tutoring center is to increase academic success by providing our 9<sup>th</sup> grade students with direct support from their upperclassmen peers.

## PARENT/GUARDIAN NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

In an effort to increase parent notification and student attendance, Belvidere School District will continue making automated attendance calls home twice a day. These calls notify you of your child's unexcused absence. Parents/guardians may check the reason or hours of reported absence on Parent Grade Access located under Parent Resources on the District's website ([www.district100.com](http://www.district100.com)) or may call the school at 815-547-6373 for Juniors and Seniors and 815-547-3718 for Freshmen and Sophomores. Attendance calls will be made beginning at 10:45 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. daily.

The district will also again notify parents via telephone of a school cancellation due to inclement weather. A school cancellation call will be made to the student's home number beginning at 5:45 a.m. In the event you do not receive a call, please notify us at 815-547-6345 the next day. Always check with local TV and radio stations to verify that school will be in session.

## **YH4L (YOUNG HEARTS FOR LIFE) ON-SITE SCREENING**

The Midwest Heart Community Foundation (MHCF) Young Hearts for Life™ Cardiac Screening is a program to identify high school students at risk for sudden cardiac death. Each week sudden cardiac death claims the lives of more than 30 young adults in the United States.

Locally MHCF is collaborating with SwedishAmerican Health System to provide free EKG screening to all area high school students as a way to identify a specific heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy or HCM.

HCM is the most common cause of sudden death in young adults comprising more than one-third of cases. HCM is a genetic abnormality present in approximately one in 500 people. It enlarges the left ventricle of the heart, which can trigger fatal heart-rhythm disturbances particularly during exercise. An electrocardiogram (EKG) can detect certain impulse patterns or “markers” associated with HCM that a stethoscope cannot.

Online registration is available now for parental registration of their high school student(s) or parents can register their students during Walk-in Registration.

Screenings will be provided to interested students at BHS on **Tuesday & Wednesday, Sept. 29-30.**

On the day of the screenings, pre-registered students are briefly excused from class and sent to the gym for

confirmation of signed parental consent. The students are sent by gender to separate areas for screening. The EKG test takes approximately 3 minutes and is conducted by volunteers trained by SwedishAmerican Health System. Cardiologists are onsite to interpret each EKG. Approximately three weeks after the screening, parents receive their child’s results. Parents of children whose screening EKG indicates further evaluation is needed are instructed to follow up with their primary care physician for additional testing.

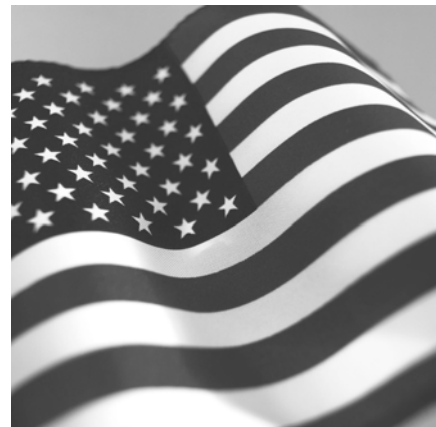
