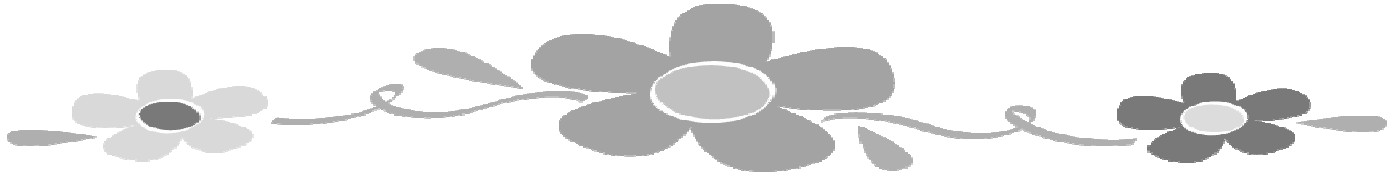

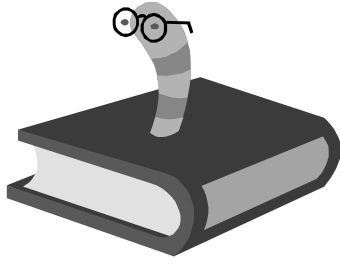

Dear Parents of Sixth (6th) Grade Students in the School Year for 2009-2010

I sent each of you a letter which had a physical form with your child's immunizations so that you could make an appointment with your doctor to get it completed. You are to complete as much as possible on that form before you go to the doctor.

***** NEW REQUIREMENTS BEGINNING FALL OF 1997-
SO THIS ISN'T SOMETHING NEW FOR THE DISTRICT.*****

- This entire physical and immunization record **MUST** be completed and turned into the school nurse by the first day of enrollment, or your child will be excluded from school until the requirements are completed.

****** NEW LEGISTRATION WHICH WAS EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2005******

- All children in sixth grade shall have dental exams. The child **MUST** show proof of having been examined by a dentist prior to May 15 of their 6th grade year.

If your child had the dental program exam while they were in 5th grade, those examines will satisfy the requirement for dental exam.

Dear Parents of Second grade and Kindergarten students:

Illinois law requires all children entering Kindergarten, and second grades to have a dental examination. The child must show proof of having been examined by a dentist prior to May 15 of their Kindergarten, and second grades. If your child needs a dental examination, please schedule the dental examine and give me a call.

Effective date: January 1, 2008

All Illinois children in kindergarten, or upon first entry into an Illinois school beyond kindergarten (i.e. 1-12), are required to have an eye examination.
